## OXON HILL MAN CONVICTED OF FIRST-DEGREE MURDER FOR KILLING STUDENT-ATHLETE

UPPER MARLBORO, MD – A 32-year-old Oxon Hill man was convicted today of killing Dorian Hurd, a 20-year-old student-athlete. Tevin Ream was found guilty of first-degree murder, use of a handgun in the commission of a felony and related charges.

On March 18, 2021, Ream shot 20-year-old Dorian Hurd, seemingly without a motive. Hurd had gone to a tattoo shop to get a tattoo at a strip mall in the 4300 Block of St. Barnabas Road. When Hurd stepped outside, surveillance video showed Ream pass by him closely, and within minutes later opened fire on Hurd, who fell to the ground with multiple gunshot wounds.

"He intended to shoot him," said Assistant State's Attorney Thea Zumwalt, during the closing arguments. "He walked right up to him and shot him in the head."

Ream then took off across the street and tried to dump the gun. He entered cleaners and hid the weapon. Officers arrested him as he exited the business.

"Today, we achieved justice for Mr. Hurd," said State's Attorney Aisha Braveboy. "This is a crime that not only impacted Mr. Hurd's family but this community because he was a young, vibrant athlete with a promising future. This verdict will hopefully bring some relief and closure to the family and ensure that Mr. Ream is held accountable for this senseless crime. I want to thank Deputy State's Attorney Perry Paylor and Assistant State's Attorney Thea Zumwalt for their hard work and dedication on this case."

Hurd, whose family and friends packed the courtroom throughout the trial, was a student at the University of the District of Columbia and was a graduate of Blake High School. Ream is scheduled to be sentenced on October 30th.
